PAST TENSES

Simple Past

Form:

Take the base verb and change the word form to the past tense form. Usually this means adding /ed/ to the end of the word. However, there are a lot of irregular verbs with different past tense forms.

AFF: She <u>went</u> to Africa three years ago NEG: She <u>didn't go</u> to Africa three years ago INT: <u>Did she go</u> to Africa three years ago?

Uses:

Actions completed in the past

EXAMPLES:

- -The scientists **conducted** an experiment. They **thought** the experiment would prove their theory.
- -Colombus discovered America in 1492

Past Continuous

Form: The past form of "to be" (was, were) + verb + ing

AFF: She <u>was having</u> a great time when her parents called her NEG: She <u>wasn't having</u> a great time when her parents called her INT: <u>Was she having</u> a great time when her parents called her?

Uses:

-Describing a past action that was happening at a certain time in the past

EXAMPLE: At 11pm, I was still working on my homework.

-Describing a past action that was interrupted by another action

EXAMPLE: I was trying to sleep when I heard a knock at my door.

-When describing two past events that took place at the same time, this tense is used to describe the longer of the two events.

EXAMPLE: She burned herself while she **was cooking** dinner.

Past Perfect

Form: had+ past form of a verb

AFF: They <u>had done</u> the homework before I arrived NEG: They <u>hadn't done</u> the homework before I arrived INT: <u>Had they done</u> the homework before I arrived?

Uses:

-We use past perfect to describe the action that happened BEFORE another action in the past

EXAMPLE: I had gone home; then I read a book and fell asleep..

Past Perfect Continuous

Form: had + been + verb + ing

AFF: They <u>had been cooking</u> when I arrived NEG: They <u>hadn't een cooking</u> when I arrived INT: <u>Had they been cooking</u> when I arrived?

Uses:

-Describing an action that began further in the past than other actions, but overlaps with actions that began later.

<u>EXAMPLE:</u> She said she **had been working** in a hospital when World War II started, and she worked there for many more years.
