Examples

1. Affirmative:

I think I will win the game.

2. Negative:

I'm sure that he won't come to my party.

3. Interrogative:

It's too hot in here. Will you open the window?

We use *will*:

- To talk about **predictions**:
 - we are saying what we know or think will happen. We are predicting the future.

(probably, I expect, I'm sure, I think, I don't think,...)

E.g. I think it will be a difficult exam.

- To talk about **on-the-spot decisions**:
 - we decide to do something at the time of speaking. We haven't decided before. The idea is new.

E.g. Your bag is heavy. I will help you!
